

SPECIAL TRANSPORT LIABILITY RULES

 Material sent between Contracting Parties (CPs): Sending Operator liable <u>unless contract</u>

 Material sent to Non-CP State: Sending Operator liable <u>until</u> <u>unloading</u> in non-CP

 Material sent from Non-CP: Receiving Operator liable but <u>upon</u> <u>written consent</u>



SPECIAL JURISDICTION RULES

BASIC RULE: Court of the Accident State (if a CP)

- 60PC/ 63VC:
 - Accident outside CP's territory:
 - Accident in EEZ wherever:
- 04PC/ 97VC & 97CSC:
 - Accident in CP's EEZ:
 - Accident in non-CP's EEZ:




